



# FOX VALLEY ESTATES POOL RULES & REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations are for the protection and benefit of all to assure safe and sanitary operation of the pool facilities. Your cooperation in abiding by these conditions will afford pleasant relaxation and recreation for all concerned. Parents are requested to caution their children to observe all rules and regulations. A qualified head lifeguard and assistants, under direct supervision of the management, will be in charge of the pool. All persons using the pool will be required to register daily at the pool. These rules may be revised at any time. Management reserves the right to refuse entry or deny pool privileges to anyone at its sole discretion.

The lifeguards supervise all activities in the water, deck and various other rooms off the deck. They observe and enforce all rules. Their primary responsibility is to ensure the safety of facility users. Their secondary responsibilities including the following: improve the use of the bathing area; keep the facility clean; supervise deep water tests; administer first aid; attend to emergencies; complete all required records and reports on schedule; attend to pool maintenance duties and dealing with lost and found articles. Swimming pool rules are established by the Board, the Lifeguard Training Manual (Red Cross or YMCA) and standards set by the State and County Health Departments.

1. The lifeguard must be on duty and the pool facility open before any user is allowed in the water or pool area.
2. All persons using the pool or pool area do so at their own risk and sole responsibility. The management does not assume responsibility for any accident or injury in connection with such use.
3. The patrons agree to save harmless the management and/or association from any and all liabilities and action whatsoever nature by any guests growing out of the use of the swimming pool or pool area.
4. Residents must present identification cards and sign in upon entering the pool facility. Guests must also sign in. Your cooperation in presenting ID and signing in helps the pool management company keep accurate records on pool usage. This ensures adequate lifeguard coverage now and in the future.
5. The use of the pool facility is permissive only. There will be no fee or charge for the use of the pool by owners.
6. Guests must be accompanied by a resident at all times. When the resident leaves, the guest must also leave. The guest must also present ID.
7. Residents will be held responsible for all actions of their guest.
8. The cost of any property damage will be charged to the responsible party.
9. Management will not be responsible for loss or damage to any personal property of any kind.
10. The pool may be closed at any time due to mechanical breakdown, operational difficulties or inclement weather. The decision is at the sole discretion of management.
11. All swimmers shall exit the pool when the lifeguard leaves his/her station or upon the lifeguard's request.
12. All bathers must shower before entering the pool. Bath houses, showers and sanitary facilities are provided.
13. Children under age 12 must be attended by an owner/occupant or designated guest age 16 years or older. If the child is in the large pool, the supervisor must be in the immediate vicinity with the child, unless the child has passed the swimming test given by the lifeguard on duty. The child's supervisor is responsible for the child's conduct. No one under 16 years of age will be permitted to use the pool until they can comply with the minimum standards for water safety which is determined by the head lifeguard.

14. Infants and children wearing diapers or who are not toilet trained are not permitted in the main pool at any time, but are allowed in the wading pool. Infants and children must wear tight fitting rubber pants or "swim diapers". In the event of fecal contamination, pool will be closer in accordance with Health Department regulations.
15. Children may use the wading pool only when accompanied by a parent or guardian. The parent or guardian must remain in the wading pool area with the child at all times. Children over age 6 are not permitted to use the wading pool.
16. When the pool is not crowded and at the discretion of the lifeguard, flotation devices and play equipment may be permitted at the pool. Patrons must accompany children in the pool when using flotation devices and not rely on the flotation devices as security and safety of their child.
17. Running, pushing, wrestling, ball playing or causing undue disturbance in or about the pool area will not be tolerated. Spouting of water or similar unhygienic acts will not be permitted in the pool.
18. No abusive or profane language or breach of the peace will be tolerated.
19. All persons use this facility at their own risk and in conformance with all rules and regulations. Individuals may be barred from the pool or pool area, at the discretion of the lifeguard in charge, for violation of said rules or for any reason which in his/her judgment constitutes a hazard to others or to the management. The lifeguard is responsible for the strict enforcement of those rules and has authorization to temporarily deprive any member or guest of same. A written statement is to be filled with the management within 24 hours if such action is taken.
20. No pets are allowed in the pool area at any time.
21. All radios must be kept at a low volume.
22. Bicycles, motorbikes and skateboards are not permitted in the pool area at any time.
23. Baby strollers and baby carriages are not permitted within 10 feet of the pool.
24. Chewing gum is not permitted in the pool area at any time.
25. Only proper type bathing suits are permissible. Cut-offs, walking shorts and apparel of the like are not permitted in the pool.
26. Admission shall be refused to all persons having infectious disease, sore or inflamed eyes, colds, nasal or ear discharges or any communicable disease of any kind. Persons with excessive sunburn, open sores or bandages or any kind will not be permitted in the pool.
27. All beverages or food brought into the pool area must be in paper or plastic containers and consumed in the designated areas. All trash must be disposed of in a trash container. Glass containers (i.e. baby food jars, drink bottles, etc) are not permitted in the pool area.
28. ABSOLUTELY NO INTOXICANTS may be brought into the pool area due to strict insurance regulations.
29. Smoking is permitted in designated areas only.
30. All personal injuries, however slight, must be reported to the lifeguard on duty.
31. A Parent/Guardian must closely watch children at all times. A Parent/Guardian must accompany a non-swimmer in the water at all times.
32. For purposes of supporting non-swimmers, pool management recommends against using inner tubes, water wings and all other flotation devices, and for safety purposes recommends the use of a life vest approved by the United States Coast Guard. Parents/ Guardians should use their discretion in choosing an appropriate flotation device, if any, for their children. If a child uses a flotation device of any kind, a parent or guardian must accompany the child in the water at all times.
